Chairman's report January 2016

Review of the year.

Three language/conversation groups continue to run, honing the skills of the brave. Thanks to **Lynn Clark** and **Maggie Hale** for their leadership of two of the groups.

This Year's plans.

We have a programme for this year which has been circulated and which I hope you will be able

to support. The most important feature being the visit by our French twinning partners from 7th to 11th July, please try to keep those dates available if at all possible.

In addition:

- We are still trying to match up a French choir with the Gislingham Silver Band for exchange concerts.
- We have been asked to locate a basketball club who would host a team of young teenage girls for a short visit, keen to try their sporting skills against an English team.
- There is to be a visit from this area, including at least one of our members, of a convoy of WW2 military vehicles which will pass through Hédé and stay a night in the town.
- Finally, we have received an invitation from the Town of Badbergen in Germany which is also twinned with Hédé to join in their visit to Hédé coming up this year in October and to pay a visit next year to Badbergen. The group from Badbergen who were at the market this year are keen to expand the range of our twinning with Hédé. It is not the first time I have come across a triangular arrangement like this but if there is some interest from us we could look into the possibilities.

Other news:

The Hédé jumelage committee has several new members and a new President in **David Hallifax** and a new secretary for the English link, **Nadine David**.

Our Association secretary **Linda Simpson** is standing down this year but has agreed to remain on the committee. I am sure you would want to join me in thanking her for her significant contribution to the Association which is thriving thanks to her drive and enthusiasm. **Judith Phillip** has agreed to take over the role and I am sure we will all give her our support, reading and responding to emails promptly.

Chairman's personal comment.

In the wake of the horrific events in Paris and throughout Europe this last year, it seems to me that the aims and the concept of twinning are still valid and relevant today. Had I still been in the position to lead an assembly at school, I could well have addressed the question of 'Who is my neighbour?' and talked for some time.

However the need for mutual support, empathy and understanding for our near neighbours in Europe is now perhaps as important as it was when twinning initiatives were set up between such cities as Dresden and Coventry and between Bristol and Hanover after WW2.

I am very much aware of the positive, engaging and friendly nature which you all display in our contacts with our French twinning partners, showing I think that the spirit of the twinning ideal is still alive in the Wortham and Burgate Twinning Association.
