First of all, I would like to thank the committee for their work over the past year, each of whom has contributed significantly to the continuing success of the Association. Secondly I would like to thank all the members for their support of our activities and for bringing along friends to our social events which helps to spread the word about our existence and to encourage new members to join.

The highlight of the year was clearly the visit of our friends from Hédé-Bazouges for the weekend at the beginning of July. We were a significant presence at the Hédé Christmas market in December, which unfortunately clashed with the market here in Wortham so we were unable to be represented at both.
